OUTSTANDING EMPLOYER AWARD

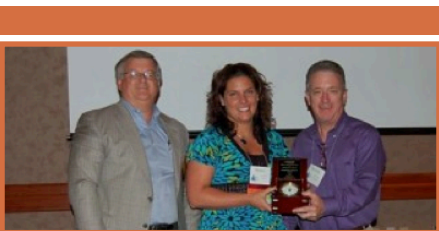
» Contribution to NCACE through participation at NCACE functions and NCACE campuses.

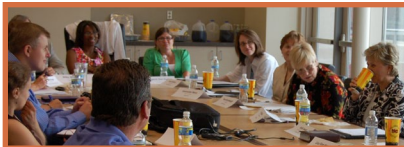
